Directions	From M5 South – Exit at Junction 5 and follow signs to Worcester City Centre passing the Cathedral and then travelling along Deansway. Stay in the right-hand lane, turning right just before you reach the road bridge over the Severn. Take the left hand lane along the North Parade, passing three sets of traffic lights before turning into Severn Terrace and following signs on to the racecourse where parking can be found. From M5 North – Exit at Junction 6 and at the roundabout follow signs to Kidderminster along a dual carriageway (A449). At the first roundabout turn left, along Ombersley Road, towards Worcester City Centre. Go straight until the road turns sharp right into Castle Street. Go down the hill and turn right at the bottom of the hill into Severn Terrace and follow signs on the racecourse where parking can be found.

Safety	Competitors must be able to swim adequately in the waters on which the race is being held. All paddlers are required to render assistance to other competitors in distress. Canoeing and Kayaking are "Assumed risk"-"Water contact sports" that may carry attendant risks. Participants should be aware of and accept these risks and be responsible for their own action and involvement.			
Buoyancy aids	Buoyancy aids are compulsory for Geoff Saunders paddlers and for all competitors ranked in Divisions 7, 8 and 9 irrespective of the division they are paddling in. This applies to singles and doubles races. The wearing of buoyancy aids by other paddlers is at the discretion of team leaders and event organiser/safety officer, bearing in mind the prevailing conditions on the day.			
Club colours	All competitors must wear club colours or points will not be awarded towards the Hasler Trophy.			
Boat check	 Boats must be reported to boat control before getting on the water. As stated in the Marathon Racing Rules, all boats must have suitable buoyancy as well as have their race number attached so they can be checked off list and boat check sticker awarded. If boat is being used twice for different races, it must come through boat check again with the new race number attached. Once your boat has passed through boat checking, it will be assumed that you have started. If you do not get on the water then you must inform the race organisers. Failure to go through boat control will result in disqualification from the race. 			
Classes	All K1 and K2 races for each division (Division 1 to Division 9), GSA, GSB, GSC (GS are non-Hasler final points) and a mini K2 (non-Hasler final points). Every effort will be made to run all classes as separate races. However, in the event of a non-quorate class, the paddlers will be transferred to the most appropriate class.			
Boat numbers	Team leaders will be given a pack of pre-numbered vertical race numbers for each of their paddlers. Number plates must be returned at the end of the race.			
Prizes	Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd places in all quorate races plus perpetual awards.

				 f) The Ken Pereira Cup will be awarded to the highest place Junior C1 in the highest division at the final 			
 g) The Rhodes White Trophy will be awarded to the senior man K1 with the fastest time over the 12 mile course 							
 h) The David Shankland Trophy will be awarded to the senior or junior woman K1 with the fastest time of the 12 mile course 							
 i) The Barber Trophy will be awarded to the junior K1 with the fastest time over the 12 mile course 							
 j) The Bill Sparks Trophy will be awarded to the highest placed veteran K2 in the highest division at the final

Additional portable toilets, including a disabled toilet will be situated nea to the car park. Additional disabled toilets are available in the Rowing Club, adjacent t the Canoe Club. Showers are available upstairs in Worcester Canoe Club.							
					The course is a lap-based race. Spectators may view the start and finish from the area in front of the canoe club or from the Sabrina Bridge. The portage may be viewed from 500 metres upstream of the Clubhouse. Much of the course can be followed on bicycle or by foot but there is a section from the top of the racecourse to turn A which is not accessible.		
Paddler refreshments will be issued free to all competitors when returning their race number. Worcester Canoe Club are providing refreshments and bar facilities.							
Dogs are allowed on site but must be kept under control, especially around the portage area. Any fouling is to be cleared up.							
No camping is available on site. However, there are local campsites that can be located here: https://www.visitworcestershire.org/business-directory/category/stay							
Club Gazebos can be erected on the grass adjacent to the car park on the centre course area of the race course (the track of the race course area must be kept clear). There is also limited space on the river bank behind the canoe club building (downstream of the Canoe Club).


